Recognizing that parents are busy, the high school is again using the automatic dialer to inform parents of student absences period by period on a daily basis. The phone calls are made in the early evening. In addition, parents will be able to view their child's attendance, progress reports and grades online through the Infinite Campus Parent Portal at www.islipufsd.org. Attendance in all classes is mandatory for student success. Students not attending class lose valuable instruction and are not able to participate in class. Since class participation is a component of the grading rubric, students will have lower grades and may fail. If you have questions or concerns regarding your child, we are here to help.

Please work directly with our Assistant Principals on all issues regarding your children. Ms. Ward can be reached in room 112 and Mr. Juengerkes can be reached in the main office.

The first day of school for students is Monday, September 9th. First period begins at 7:20 a.m. Students are to report directly to their first period class as indicated on their schedule. Any questions regarding schedules should be directed to the guidance department.

This year we are again enforcing the district cell phone policy. Cell phones are to be turned off and not visible during the school day. Cell phones will be confiscated if they are seen in the building during the school day. Please make sure your son or daughter understands this policy and does not have a visible cell phone during school hours.

As the new school year opens, I would like to thank you for your continuing support. In order for students to succeed, it is critical that students attend school on a regular basis, arrive to class on time, dress appropriately, complete homework and, in general, abide by school policies, some of which are outlined in this newsletter. Most important to student success is parent involvement. Please continue to ask questions and keep the lines of communication open.

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## LUNCH

Students may choose hot lunch, sandwiches or salad. Lunch periods are periods 4 through 7. An application for free and reduced lunch is available online or on the main office counter and should be returned to the nurse's office. Applications in Spanish are also available.

## - HATS

Uncovering one's head is a sign of respect and good manners. This practice is applicable to schools as well as institutions such as courts of law, many houses of worship and most places of business. Part of the educational process is learning and practicing respect for others and good manners. Students are not permitted to wear headgear in the building during the school day, 7:20 am to 1:58 pm., unless it is for religious reasons.

Students must bring their schedule to school on the first day of classes, September 9th. Students are expected to attend every class and study hall as assigned.

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Teachers are available every day after school for extra help and makeup work beginning at 2:00 pm. See your teacher to make specific arrangements. Successful students make it a point to seek extra help before grades begin to slip. Teachers are always willing to help if asked. Students must make time to get help when necessary. Bus transportation is available at 2:50 pm each day for students who stay for extra help.

## STUDENT ATTENDANCE

**ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL**: All absences should be reported to the high school attendance office by a parent any time after 7:00 a.m. on the day of the absence. The attendance office can be reached at 650-8310.

LUNCH RELEASE: Leaving school grounds for lunch is a privilege limited to members of the senior class only. Seniors who wish to leave the school grounds during their assigned lunch period may obtain a permission form from the attendance



guardian. When the completed form is returned to the attendance office, a valid 2013-2014 lunch sticker will be placed on the student's ID card.

Only students who are able to show their validated ID card will be permitted to leave school grounds for lunch. Students who leave without permission are subject to disciplinary action. Until permission forms have been completed and ID stickers obtained, it is expected that all students will remain on campus during lunch. The District Attendance Policy is available on line or on the main office counter. It is important to note that class participation is a component of the grading rubric. Students not in class cannot participate. This may adversely impact their grade.

## STUDENT INFORMATION

Islip High School student handbooks which include a detailed program planner, assignment book and other important information will be distributed to every student during the first days of school. These handbooks will provide a daily calendar to help students organize and plan their responsibilities. Detailed explanations of school rules, procedures and the like are included in this publication. Please review this important document with your child and become familiar with how the high

school is organized. With formal instruction limited to 40 minutes per subject per day, it is not possible for all learning activities to occur in the classroom. Consequently, students must expect to have homework assigned on a daily basis in most classes. Homework is not an option but a meaningful activity designed to reinforce and enhance the learning which takes place in the classroom. Students should expect to spend between two and three hours per

day on outside preparation for class activities. Although this may vary from one day to the next, a detailed survey taken recently indicated that this is the minimum amount of time needed for student success. Parental support in providing an appropriate place for homework to be completed, as well as insisting that students make sufficient time in their daily schedule to complete these responsibilities, is essential for academic suc-

## STUDENT BUS SCHEDULES




Student bus schedules are available online at www.islipufsd.org on the transportation page. Students who show a valid high school photo ID card with a bus authorization sticker will be permitted to board buses either coming to or going home from school. New students (ninth graders and new entrants) will receive photo ID cards the first week of school. Upper classmen should use their ID card from last year. Students who need a replacement ID may obtain one by paying \$5 in the main office.

## TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

Traffic regulations during arrival and dismissal times prohibit traffic in front of the high school building while school buses are present. If you enter the school grounds from Union Boulevard, you must exit back onto Union Boulevard after discharging/picking up passengers. Cars entering from Montauk Highway must "U" turn in front of the gym entrance and exit onto Montauk Highway. For the safety of our students, please be extremely cautious when driving in and around school grounds.



## **LUNCH RELEASE**



All students are required to stay in the building during their lunch period. Only **SENIORS** who have a lunch release form completed and signed by their parents and approved by the Attendance Office are permitted to leave school and/or school grounds during lunch periods. This is a privilege that is granted to seniors who are in good academic standing and can be revoked if a situation arises. Authorized seniors must use the doors by the cafeteria or the doors by the main office to enter or leave the building for lunch.

It is illegal for any child ment of Motor Vehicles. Only seniors with a valid Class 5 (senior) license are permitted to bring a vehicle on school grounds.

> Junior licenses do not allow students to drive to school unless they are accompanied by a licensed driver. We do not issue parking stickers to seniors with junior licenses.

> A student parking area is available near the Union Boulevard entrance to the high school. Because of space limitations, parking is based on a ten

point eligibility system which is detailed later in this newsletter. Eligible students may register a vehicle by presenting a license, vehicle registration and signed parental permission form to the main office. Students are not permitted to operate two or three wheeled motorized vehicles on school property at any time. Detailed regulations concerning driving to school can be obtained from the main office or your local motor vehicle office.

## STUDENT LOCKERS

Assignments and combinations are included in the summer mailing. Please be sure to bring it with you on the first day of school.

Lost locker assignments and combinations can be obtained in the attendance office upon presentation of a valid student iden-



tification card.

Lockers are only secure when locked. Students who leave lockers unlocked to save time invite loss of materi-Keep your locker locked at all times!

## SENIOR PARKING

#### **FOREWORD**

The privilege of driving to school is an opportunity sought by many of the high school seniors each year. Due to the increasing class sizes and a relatively small number of parking spaces available, revisions needed to be made to the current "first come, first serve" policy regarding the assignment of parking spaces to seniors.

#### **GOAL**

The goal of revising the senior parking policy is to offer a fair way to distribute parking spots to students and to increase the number of students who receive parking spots each school year.

#### **PROCEDURE**

Eligible seniors will be given a parking permit on a quarterly basis. Seniors who have a parking permit will be allowed to park in the student parking lot on a "first come, first serve" basis. In the case that the student lot is full, students must find parking off campus.



A ten-point system will be in effect during each quarter. Students who meet or exceed the ten-point limitation will not receive a parking permit for the next quarter. Each student will begin each quarter with zero points. The ten-point system is based on behavior and attendance. An out-of-school suspension is 10 points, a full-day detention is 5 points, and an unexcused absence is 1 point. Behavior and attendance from fourth quarter of junior year will be used to determine eligibility for first-quarter of senior year.

Senior Parking Ten Point Eligibility System To stay eligible you must stay under 10 points!
